On the Value of Humility Jason Poston ~ Blue Belt ~ IHF HQ



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The other day I ran into Grand Master Han outside the Do-Jang when he was starting off on a walk. I interrupted him by bowing and eagerly coming over

to say hello, and he gave me his time with natural grace. He was out for exercise, and so I tried to "pay" for his time by using, and then foolishly trying to explain, the following expression: "A journey of a thousand miles begins with the first step." I actually acted it out in front of him, putting one foot in front of the other, etc.

Still, he seemed confused. What does this mean?" he asked. Finally, I lamely explained that, when one trains, he or she is taking steps along a long journey, and there is great honor in taking those first steps. . . . So much talk! It was a glorious afternoon, and I was happy to see Grand Master Han in good spirits. We bowed and said goodbye, and I pondered what he had said. Truly, I was troubled by my presumption, though I meant no harm. I was sure I'd taken too much of his time. Now I realize that the appropriate thing

would have been to bow to Grand Master Han, say a happy hello and then say *nothing*. "Then, we could have enjoyed the moment utterly without distraction. In other words, had I not presumed to speak, the moment would have existed *by itself*. There is great power in silence. Looking back on that day, the moments I cherish with Grand Master Han are in silence, with the wind in the trees and the sun in our hair.

Humility leads to silence, which is essential to learning. It is like a vehicle that conveys more information than one might think.
